"The cold and the rain led her, with the rest of the crowd, to the indoor shopping mall. Everywhere was brightly lit. Everyone, it seemed, was shopping in twos and threes. No-one else was on their own. Everyone was in a tearing hurry, rushing about, heads down.

There was a strange new shop, Alice noticed, on one side of the mall. The sign about the door said "The Christmas Preparation Shop". There was nothing at all in the window. Completely empty. Inside there was nothing on the shelves.

'Strange,' thought Alice. 'Have they sold out already? Or is it so new that they haven't got any stock yet?'

She pressed her nose up against the window. Around the sides of the shop were little cubicles. Each was equipped with a telephone, pens, envelopes and paper, but nothing else. There were no customers, unlike every other shop in the mall which was packed out. No one else seemed to take the slightest notice...

JB led Alice and Sam into the doorway of the new shop Alice had seen on the way in. 'I was looking at this before,' said Alice. 'It doesn't seem to sell anything.' 'Absolutely right,' said JB, opening the door and leading them in. 'It doesn't sell anything at all. Everything in here is given away...

The most important lesson to learn about getting ready for Christmas is the one about forgiveness. All over the world, people hurt those they love in terrible ways... Scratch the surface of any family and you will find deep fractures.

Why do you think it is that people spend so much on Christmas? What is it they are looking for in the bright lights and decorations, food and drink...?

'And that is why the most important lesson in preparing for Christmas is this: use these weeks before the Holy Day to practice forgiveness, to be reconciled, to let go of old hurts and wounds, to bring hearts and lives together again. There is no better way to get ready for the King.

'The best way is just to decide you will forgive, and if you can, let the person know. That's why this little centre is equipped with phones and pens and paper...'

May the blessings of the Prince of Peace be with you this Christmas.

Charity Giving

The PCC have been given some very serious thought to how, as a Parish, we support charity and mission agencies. We would like to put a more systematic system in place. This was also discussed at this year's APCM and in other places and we have listened carefully.

It has been agreed that in 2024 we will give 5% of all regular giving to 4 charities or mission agencies and then also ask that other events and activities support them as well. We will look at our budgets but would like to raise this percentage figure to 7.5% in 2025 and then 10% in 2026. We would also encourage other ways to support these charities. We will look to support these chosen charities for a 2/3 year period recognising that regular and ongoing gifts are good for their own budget setting and work. It would be appropriate to think of support for local, national and international organisations.

So, we would like some help in determining which charities/mission agencies to support. We have come with simple criteria:

- Christian based/founded or supportive of Kingdom values
- An ease of building relationship/partnership with the organisation
- People/families within the parish who can act as natural advocates to keep us informed
- An ability to be able to invite speakers and receive regular communication from the organisation
- An inter-generational appeal can all-ages find ways to engage and support

Would you be able to nominate a charity or mission agency? If so, would you please write a brief paragraph synopsis based on the above criteria for The Ministry Team to consider - send it to the Parish Office by email or note by the end of November. They will then put a proposal to the January 2024 PCC meeting for consideration. At that meeting there will be a full written policy presented so that we have a basis for review and consistency.

As well as the chosen charities we will continue our regular support for Karamoja, The Anna Chaplaincy and Youth & Children's Ministry. Also we would always encourage local practical support for local charities and organisations as we know is so prolific amongst our worshipping communities.

We will ensure we always make good use of Gift Aid possibilities.

We look forward to your ideas, and support of this way forward.

We are making some regular changes to our Evening Services across each month.

Week 2

A time of prayer for the parish, our community and nation interspersed with Bible readings and reflective songs. There will be space to share ideas for prayer and then time to pray quietly or altogether. 'Be still and know that I am God' This replaces the Saturday Zoom prayers. It lasts about 50 minutes.

Week 3

Choral Evensong service from the Book of Common Prayer. This service is led by the choir who sing a psalm, Magnificat, Nunc Dimittis and an anthem. There are traditional hymns accompanied by the organ. There are also two Bible Readings, a short sermon and prayers of intercession. It typically lasts about 50 -60 minutes and occasionally we end with 'drinks and nibbles'.

Week 4

Informal Evening Service - an informal service led by a group of people who plan it together. The music is led by a small band and we sing a variety of contemporary worship songs. It contains teaching, open prayer, 'Talking Jesus' discussion and times of sharing. It lasts about 60 minutes. For October and November we will look at 'The Church in Harmony' and the Book of Colossians. Come and come and relax in the Lord's presence and meet with Him afresh.

Eco Corner

This time I simply quote from a number of reports recently published, as they sum up the bad news and the good.

UN Climate Change News, 26 October 2022:

A new report from UN Climate Change shows countries are bending the curve of global greenhouse gas emissions downward but underlines that these efforts remain insufficient to limit global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees Celsius by the end of the century

The Carnegie Endowment for International Peace says:

There are plenty of reasons to worry about climate change in 2023, from recordhigh coal consumption to record-high ocean temperatures. As climate scientists at the United Nations and protestors in the streets keep reiterating, humanity is in a climate crisis.

And yet it's not all bad news. Positive trends—like the rapid spread of electric vehicles and solar panels and the recent decline in Amazon Rainforest deforestation—give humans reason to hope. It's worth talking about this good news to forestall fatalism and encourage more action.

EuroNews Green reports that Energy generated by fossil fuels in the EU hit a record low in the first half of 2023, In the first half of 2023, the 27 member states burned 17 per cent less fossil fuels for electricity than during the same period in 2022.

The study from clean energy think tank Ember found that between January and June, fossil fuels generated just 33 per cent of electricity - their lowest-ever share of the EU's power mix.

We just need to go faster. I long for the day when there is a report that atmospheric greenhouse gases have actually gone down.




