#### First Thoughts ...

It seems to me that we are often saying hello and goodbye to people in our Ministry Team. It is a joy to see people grow and move on and then see what God is doing in their lives and it is also so good to welcome people in and see them fit in and develop their gifts and skills.

Recently we said good bye to Martha Lloyd who was an energetic and loved youth and children's worker. We also said our farewells to Gordon - a valuable Associate Vicar who was much loved for his enthusiasm and care. We are in the process of evaluating our provision and ministry for children, families and young people. We hope, in the very near future, to advertise for a new member of the team. For our youth ministry we are buying some resource and time from The Kings Arms - the PCC recently agreed this. Would you please pray for our Youth, Children and Family Work Committee as they prepare, put paperwork together and move us towards an appointment.

As you already know we have made an exciting and successful appointment of a new Associate Vicar. Revd David Chattell will be joining us soon. David is

coming all the way from Preston Candover where he has been the Vicar of The Candover Valley, Farleigh and Wield for the past twelve years. I know that the people of these parishes are very sad to know that he is leaving yet we are really pleased to welcoming an experienced and creative priest. David will move into the Holybourne Vicarage with his wife, Ruth and their children towards the end of February. We have a licensing date - Monday 18th March when the Bishop of Winchester will be with us in the evening. David and Ruth will then take much needed holiday until Easter and begin work with us the following week. We have much to look forward to - God is good! Please pray for David and Ruth and their family in this time of transition.



In the wider church we have welcomed our new Bishop of Winchester to the diocese. Bishop Philip's appointment was announced some time ago and he and his wife, Ruth, moved to Winchester back in the autumn. Yet it was only on 13th January that we enjoyed his welcome service in Winchester Cathedral. It was an extremely moving service with fabulous music, intimate prayers and joy. We are so pleased to have Bishop Philip with us and we will be seeing him out and about amongst the diocese. In his welcome service sermon he spoke of 'heritage, healing and hope'. As clergy in the Diocese we were fortunate to have

a residential conference with Bishop Philip in the week following the welcome service. It was good to be with him and everyone else! One of the things Bishop Philip shared with us was a quote from G.K. Chesterton -

'The more I considered Christianity, the more I found that while it had established a rule and order, the chief aim of that order was to give room for good things to run wild.'

A mark of our ministry is to be ordered but also to allow wild things to emerge. I find this so encouraging and as we pray for our new Youth, Children and Families Worker and for David it is a clear and imaginative focus. May God answer our prayers and find us willing to keep serving and seeing His church grow.

#### Alton Walking Church for Men - 2024 Programme

In 2024 we will be branching out into some new territory, visiting some different hostelries and exploring fresh paths. It was great to be averaging a dozen stalwart walkers and even a couple of dogs on each of our walks last year: so let's see what God has in store for us this year. There are seven walks, six to eight weeks apart, but avoiding any clash with the Alton Walking Festival in May.

As ever there will be a brief talk and a prayer to set us on our way and develop a biblical perspective on the journey ahead. Each walk will be between an hour and a half and two hours at a moderate pace, including time to pause and reflect.

#### OPEN SIGHT



#### Ways to keep warm each winter <u>and</u> reduce your carbon footprint

Are you feeling the cold and worrying about the cost of heating your house? Many in the Parish and our town will feel the same way. So, what can you do apart from putting on an extra jumper and heading off to one of the warm hubs in Alton?

In most houses its possible to make some simple improvements that will save energy costs and make you feel more comfortable. The question is where to start and what will it cost?

For several years Energy Alton has been giving out free advice to homeowners. The easiest way is to book a free home energy survey. One of our volunteer energy surveyors will spend about an hour with you and then give a report with some practical suggestions. Often the easiest to do such as draught proofing and insulation are the cheapest as well.

We are also able to offer a grant of up to  $\pounds100$  or 50% of the cost of any energy saving work if you live in a property that is in Council tax bands A to D.





#### Notes from a Curious Choir

Things are quite quiet on the choir front at present so I was a bit stuck for what to blether on about, as we say in Scotland. Currently, we're practicing an anthem for Candlemas in February and that got me curious about this holy day. If you were to ask the average person in the street, I doubt they would have a clue as to what you were on about. So, I've done a bit of trawling on t'interweb and I have some interesting facts for you. Candlemas is celebrated on 2<sup>nd</sup> February and marks the return of light, a symbol of protection and prosperity. This Christian festival commemorates the presentation of Jesus at the Temple of Jerusalem, referring to him as the light of the people of Israel. On this day, Christians take candles to be blessed in church, while for those with a sweet tooth, this day is also a chance to eat pancakes. The consumption of pancakes would be a tribute to the cycle of seasons and more precisely to the arrival of Spring which announces better days. Elsewhere in the world, people eat cornbased dishes or watch out for a groundhog emerging from hibernation!

As to the origin of pancakes, Pope Gelasius I is said to have given wafers or flatbread to pilgrims arriving in Rome. However, there are also other stories and superstitions. Round, golden pancakes served in February are evocative of the sun and may have been a symbol of fertility and prosperity. In order to obtain an abundant harvest, a farmer would traditionally flip the first pancake with his right hand while holding a gold coin in his left hand. The gold coin would then be wrapped inside the pancake and kept at the top of a wardrobe until the following year, to then be given to the first poor person encountered; covered in mouldy pancake, no doubt!

Now to the groundhog connection. The United States and Canada celebrate Groundhog Day on the same day as Candlemas, 2<sup>nd</sup> February. On this day, the custom is to try to predict the end of winter by observing a groundhog burrow. If the weather is cloudy and the emerging rodent does not see its shadow, spring will soon arrive. However, if it is sunny and the mammal sees its shadow, it will be frightened and retreat to its den to continue hibernating. It is then said that winter will last another six weeks. Let's hope its cloudy on 2<sup>nd</sup> February!

Candlemas honours the end of winter and the return of light, so various proverbs link it to the weather, to the cold or the return of the sun. Here are two examples:

"If Candlemas Day be fair and bright, winter will have another fight."

"If Candlemas Day brings cloud and rain, winter won't come again."

So, there you go. A few snippets of Candlemas information which might be useful for a quiz or give you a teeny bit of smugness as you now know more than most people.




