First Thoughts ...

Christmas or Easter, which one is your favourite?

Of course, for many people the instinctive reaction is probably Christmas. Christmas is by far the biggest event of the year in our country and in much of the western world. Christmas is certainly the biggest consumer event of the year and is often referred to as "the saviour" of many retailers with billions of pounds being spent. Father Christmas is a very busy - and we all help him out just a little bit! Also it has been noted that if you were to take Christ out of Christmas all you would be left with is "M&S".

There can be no doubt that the joy and fun of Christmas is a wonderful thing and that it is rightly enjoyed by all generations - we just love it, don't we? . This year in The Parish of the Resurrection there was a great deal of joy and fun and it was wonderful to have so many people come and join us at our Church events. I thank God for the success of all these events, but I am also extremely grateful to all the many people who gave up their time to help make them happen. And we managed to keep it all going until we got to Candlemas - I packed the crib scene away in St Lawrence the week following that - the beginning of February!

Whilst Father Christmas is a very busy man, I read recently that in America they produce five million marshmallow chicks and bunny's a day in preparation for Easter. I can only try to imagine how many chocolate eggs are being produced in our world right now.


In the Church at this time of year the joy and fun of Christmas begins to be replaced by the anticipation of Easter. Easter comes with more complex thoughts and feelings than the very natural joy of Christmas. There is the triumphal entry on Palm Sunday, Jesus' last meal with his friends, Judas' betrayal of Jesus, crucifixion and death on Good Friday, hopelessness and despair on Saturday, followed by resurrection hope and victory on Easter Day. I am grateful that we have Lent to think about these things and prepare ourselves.

Yes - we are in Lent already. It all started on 14th February with Ash Wednesday falling on Valentine's Day. There is something quite consistent that we start our period of preparation on the same day we celebrate love. We are preparing for the biggest love event in history. God's love for you and me that Jesus dies and then rises again - and we are loved so much that our sins are forgiven and eternal life is guaranteed.

But back to where I started. Without Christmas there could never have been Easter but without Easter there would have been no point to Christmas. When the Son of God came to us at Christmas, he fully understood why he had come. For the Christmas Messiah to be our saviour, for the joy of Christmas to become a reality, the cross and resurrection of Easter had to happen. Jesus' mission had to be completed.

On Sundays during Lent we are going to look at some of the Last Words of Jesus - great preparation and we also have the Alton Churches Lent Sessions where we look at 'How the Early Church Shapes Us Today'. Please engage with these as we look for signs and glimpses of God's love for each and everyone of us. I encourage you all to seek a fuller joy of both Christmas and Easter this Lent. Let us look forward eagerly yet patiently.

Eco Corner

You may remember that, in October 2021, I wrote a piece called 'Time to go Electric?'. This looked at the challenges of owning an electric car. Technology has moved on since then and you might think that many of the challenges would have been overcome.

Here are a few facts.

U.S. sales of Electric Vehicles (EVs) are well below their Government target, despite generous Government subsidies.

Given that 2035 has been set for sales of Petrol and Diesel cars to stop, it is interesting that only 2% of Europe's cars are elelctric.

Electric cars are 30% to 40% more expensive that Petrol and Diesel

A large U,S rental car company has sold off 20,000 EVs because they are too expensive to repair.

Addison Lee, a London provider of business transport, has abandoned its dream of an all-electric fleet.

Despite the general high reliability of electronic and electric devices, EVs are less reliable than Petrol and Diesel.

Second hand EVs are hard to sell because their range is limited in comparison with the most recent new models

The high EV repair costs are reflected in higher insurance premiums.

On the positive side, charging problems that I mentioned before are being addressed and rapid charging points are appearing, particularly at Motorway service areas. I have even seen them at a local Garden Centre.

Electricity suppliers are offering deals for cheap overnight, off peak, home charging.

The development of the EV is only in its infancy, so watch and wait remains a good option. Or, you could sell your car and ride an e-bike instead.







ST LAWRENCE CE PRIMARY SCHOOL



Just recently, Fairtrade Fortnight was upon us. Our school was then "blitzed" with Fairtrade decorations. Within each class we did a quiz and the winner from each class collected a prize in front of the school. We learnt lots of facts about the different farmers, their lives and what we can do to help. Making small changes can make a big impact. We specifically looked at the Fairtrade premium which is where farmers set aside a little bit of their earnings to put towards hospitals, wells and homes.

POTR Eco Church

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you - 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18

Working towards achieving Eco Church awards & embedding Eco Church principles in all that POTR does can seem like endless "doing" – setting up new activities and projects, etc. But the role of prayer is as, or in fact, more important than all the "doing".

You will be aware of the monthly Eco Church prayer that is chosen by Jenny and included on the website, in Parish Matters & used weekly in our Intercessions. As with all prayer, these prayers aim to focus our thanksgiving for God's amazing creation and to ask for God's help in valuing and not undermining its benefits and beauty.

Praying without ceasing was the aim of the Lent Vigil for Climate Justice 2024, happening between 14th & 24th February. This 264-hour vigil took place in Parliament Square and was organised by a group of Christian charities (including Christian Aid, A Rocha & Tearfund) under the banner of No Faith in Fossil Fuels. Anyone who believes in the power of prayer could sign up to be there to pray for an hour, a day or longer – at the time of writing I am looking forward to being there on the 21^{st.} Prayers focused on creation, global climate justice and positive political action.

When climate news all seems negative it is hard to believe prayer is being answered. Unearthed is the investigative journalism arm of Greenpeace which sends a regular email reporting on environmental justice; as well as the bad news, the email always includes one or two pieces of good news. And reports of Tearfund's work in the global south is evidence that positive change is happening, all powered by prayer.

We can all pray, anywhere and at any time so please remember the work of Eco Church, here and throughout the world, the charities who work for the alleviation of the impact of climate injustice and for politicians who have the power to make the big decisions that affect the climate. And look & give thanks for the answers to those prayers.


