#### First Thoughts ...

During May we hit several important Christian days and themes. First on Thursday 9th we have Ascension Day which is always celebrated 40 days after Easter Day. Then 10 days after that we celebrate Pentecost, that being Sunday 19th and the week after that on 26th May is Trinity Sunday when we remember God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Many people, when they think about it all, struggle to understand the concept of a God that is Three in One. Here is one way to begin to unpick this theological nightmare! So, question - why is your television like the Trinity? And a trick question - how many colours does your television set use?

Answer: Just three: red, green and blue. And in that order, just like a rainbow (where reds are at one side, blues at the opposite side, green in the middle). This is known as "RGB". I only hope that our new technologies still use this as my illustration might be void!!

These are TV's three primary colours which, when their luminescence is fired at your eyes, give all the colours of the visible spectrum. These are all "additive" colours. In fact, mix these three together in different proportions, and your screen can offer you 16 million + colours.

You'll soon call out the repair man if your television loses one of its three colours and all the presenters look as though they came from Mars. But change the intensity of any one colour (red, green or blue) even slightly and you change the overall colour.

Switch them all off, and you are left with black. Let all three of them shine at full brightness, at the same point – and then as if by magic you have a totally different colour: WHITE!

It's a parable which illustrates the Holy Trinity. Three completely distinct persons (Father, Son and Holy Spirit), just as your TV set has three quite separate colours: red, green, blue. If you take away any one member of the Trinity, you slip into theological error; take away any one of the three colours, and you call out the TV repair engineer!

So -

It DOES matter that God is our Creator and Father - otherwise our whole life is merely a meaningless illusion.

It DOES matter that Jesus is God the Son, for otherwise his death is simply a human tragedy, with no promise of salvation or eternal life.

It DOES matter that the Holy Spirit is with us here and now, otherwise we are disconnected from God.

Yes it really does matter! Just as it is essential that a TV set can produce white by the equal intensity of all of its three colours. In fact, the more you think about it, the more it seems that the doctrine of the Trinity is far from being a

complicated bit of theological nonsense, but is a sort of theological test-card, to make sure that we've got the right picture of God, without distortion. Do come and worship with us as celebrate all that God brings to our lives and community.





#### News from Resurrection Furniture

#### Alton and Alresford Deaneries

Those eagle-eyed amongst you will have realised that in the service we had to welcome Revd David and Ruth Chattell I was also licensed as Acting Area Dean of Alresford. This came about because we took David away from this role when we appointed him as Associate Vicar. Bishop David, in his wisdom, approached me to hold both deaneries in plurality. It was decided that both Deanery Chapters (that is the regular meetings of clergy) and the Deanery Synods would meet together for the next year. We have already had one Chapter meeting which was totally positive experience with much good conversation and excitement for the future. We have a Synod meeting planned for the end of June. Both deaneries have much in common and we are dedicated to working together for a good future. You never know, it might be decided to make this permanent!

#### Sunday 5th May

We will look forward to a service together with our Alton Methodist friends at 10am on Sunday 5th May. The only other service that day will be a 8am Book of Common Prayer Service at St Lawrence Church. The 10am service (and please note the time) will be led by Revd Canon Andrew Micklefield and the preacher will be Revd David Hinchliffe. David Hinchliffe is Chair of the South East District for the Methodist Church - a bit like a Bishop in C of E terms. With over 20 years ministerial experience before coming back to the South East District, David was Chair of the Channel Islands District and Superintendent Minister of the Bailiwick of Guernsey. We look forward to being with him. There will be children's groups as part of this service. It is always good to be together.

#### Alton Stroke Support Group

We have recently formed an Alton Stroke Support Group. According to information from our three local medical practices, there are more than 400 stroke victims in Alton and the surrounding area, so a support network is badly needed.

The Alton Stroke Support Group provides support for all stroke survivors, their families and supporters in Alton and the surrounding villages.

We have monthly meetings at Alton Cardiac Rehab Centre (next to Alton Sports Centre) where we provide information, support, social gatherings and health activities, and opportunities to share experiences and make connections. We invite expert speakers on health and related topics of interest to stroke victims, and also arrange monthly activities and visits - for example to garden centres, and in June we are visiting Lasham Glider Heritage Museum.

We meet on the first Tuesday of every month, from 2pm to 3.30pm and ALL stroke survivors, supporters and families ARE WELCOME.





It's based on principles from the Bible and the 12-steps-of-recovery process, backed by 1-to-1 coaching and a support group of others wanting to tackle their habits. I can never say THANK YOU enough times as I never thought I could beat this addiction". A woman now in recovery from alcohol addiction said "I wouldn't be where I am today, if I hadn't come on Fresh Start".

#### Eco Corner - Shipping

Overall, world-wide shipping ranks among the top-10 largest emitters of Carbon Dioxide and other atmospheric pollutants.

I recently had the opportunity to interview the Officers of a 1000 passenger Cruise Ship, It became clear that they are concerned that all of their operations are as Eco-friendly as possible. For example, the Head Chef was asked about how much food was wasted. From experience, he can look at the menus for the six restaurants he manages and assess the number of servings likely to be ordered for each dish. This is just the sort of thing where Artificial Intelligence could help, but human intelligence is doing pretty well and keeps wastage to around five percent.

The Chief Engineer is responsible for a large empire occupying half the space below the passenger decks. As well as the main engines, fuel tanks and generators supplying electricity for propulsion and all the Hotel services, he is responsible for desalination plant to create drinking water, refrigeration, ventilation and air conditioning and waste water purification to three times more stringent levels than required internationally. The list just goes on.

The main engines, which burn heavy oil, run generators supplying electricity to the rest of the all-electric ship. The ship does about 0.03 miles per gallon. Any change from burning oil would involve major redesign of all large ships for the future.


All credit to the Chief Engineer, he is taking interest in all the possibilities we have talked about on Eco Corner. These include natural gas, hydrogen, ammonia, batteries storing clean electricity, methanol and sustainable diesel fuel.


Globally, the International Maritime Organisation (IMO) has set a target that shipping should be over 90% net zero emission by 2050.

Whichever solutions are chosen, all require massive changes in infrastructure to deliver the necessary quantities of affordable fuel. Sadly, we are far from making progress at the rate required to meet the IMO target.

Another case of 'watch this space'.

#### POTR Eco Church

#### For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. Ephesians 2: 10



By the time this edition of Sunrise is published, the  $4^{th}$  session on the development of a legally binding **plastics treaty** will have concluded. The UN has set a deadline of the end of 2024 for this treaty to be completed – the  $5^{th}$  & final session will be held in South Korea later this year.

The need for this treaty is urgent – plastic pollution affects us all; we are increasingly aware of microplastics that are released into the environment and end up in what we eat and drink. Plastic causes injury and death in our rivers and oceans & no one can be ignorant of plastic waste dumped by the roadside, on public paths and in public spaces.

Where does plastic go when we have finished using it? Globally, only 10 % of plastic is recycled; plastic that goes to landfill takes in excess of 450 years to breakdown (& it then forms part of the earth in which it decomposes). Plastic waste that is burned contributes to CO2 emissions. Plastic waste is exported to low-income countries which then suffer the life & eco system changing effects. So, what you may ask, has this got to do with the Church & with our Christian faith? The answer is everything – we are commanded by God to care for all Creation and to love our neighbour as ourselves.


How can we follow these commands in relation to plastic?

- Take simple steps in our own lives to **reduce our consumption of single use plastic** - carry a refillable water bottle, refuse plastic carrier bags when shopping, where there is a choice, buy products in glass or aluminium containers which are recyclable.
- **Speak truth to power** -lobby our local & national governments, urging them to do the right thing
- And most importantly pray pray for decision makers & influencers, for large corporations, for government & for environmental activists, like Tearfund who work tirelessly on this issue.
