#### First Thoughts ...

#### Dear Friends

Blazing June? Perhaps, but my forecasting is not up to three weeks ahead! We are in the season of Village fetes, sports days, holidays taken and planned. The Trooping of the colour, Father's Day, racing at Ascot, tennis at Wimbledon, Cricket matches, to say nothing of our local wine walks and open gardens. Those with birthdays in June will have an anniversary to celebrate and there might be a wedding too adding even more events to be celebrated this month. Let's hope it stays fine for all those evening BBQs!

"There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens, a time to be born and a time to die" (Ecclessiastes 3:1)The ancient writer goes on to list thirteen other activities and seasons in life that fit in between the first that he mentions! We could add in all of June's activities and many more things that make us so busy.

The Bible speaks of another season, a time when it is "time to seek the Lord, while He may be found, to call on Him while He is near." (Isaiah 55:6,7). When might this be? Given that we are busy folk, what time do we have to give to God? Should He be a priority? What happens if we do not give our attention to God? The time to seek God, to worship God is now. Psalm 95, the Venite in the Prayer Book, exhorts us to worship God *now*, "Today, if you will hear His voice... let us worship and bow down; Let us kneel before the Lord our Maker...he is our God... we the people of His pasture...the sheep of His hand."

Jesus knew that there are many competing interests in the human heart for our worship and told the parable of the farmer who sowed seed on various soils. Amongst the less fertile areas was the weed and thorn patch that choked out the tender shoots.

The seeds that fell among the thorns represent those who hear the message, but all too quickly the message is crowded out by the cares and riches and pleasures of this life. And so they never grow into maturity. And the seeds that fell on the good soil represent good-hearted people who hear God's word, cling to it, and patiently produce a huge harvest. Luke 8: 5-15.

Jesus warns that we may be so absorbed in other things that his teaching about God's kingdom and the gospel may be lost to us and although we have heard them, perhaps many times, we have not understood and the "message is crowded out by the cares and riches and pleasures of this life".

Let us find the time, let it be this season in which we stop and think more about life and God, to enquire further and reflect on whether we really have understood what Jesus came for. May I encourage you to come to a church and join us in the worship of God? To read the Bible and find that God speaks through his

word, for He has time for us! We would love to welcome you to any of our churches for worship and I do look forward to meeting you soon.



#### Charity and Mission Giving in The Parish of the Resurrection

The PCC have been giving some very serious thought to how, as a Parish, we support charity and mission agencies. We are putting a more systematic system in place. This was also discussed at the APCM in 2023 and in other places and we have listened carefully.

It has been agreed that in 2024 we will give 5% of all regular giving to some chosen charities or mission agencies and then also ask that other events and activities support them as well. We will look at our budgets but would like to raise this percentage figure to 7.5% in 2025 and then 10% in 2026. We would also encourage other ways to support these charities.

We will look to support these chosen charities for a 2/3 year period recognising that regular and ongoing gifts are good for their own budget setting and work. We have worked to identify support for local, national and international organisations.

So From May 2024 the PCC agreed the following charities to be supported. We had previously asked for ideas from the congregations and wanted to have people in the parish who would be advocates for each one so that we get regular communication and input.

#### The Alton & District Community Relief Fund

This is the new version of the Covid Reslience Fund which operated successfully. It has been established as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) with the following Trustees: Andrew Lawrence – Lead Elder, Harvest Church Alton; Lisa Hillan – POTR PCC; David Millard – Alton Citizens Advice Bureau; Paul Susans – POTR worshipping community; Moira Baker – Alton Lions

The Fund is to make grants of up to £500 to individuals who require urgent assistance with essentials such as replacing household appliances, acquiring mobility equipment, getting furniture, carpets and beds. The fund will also help with repairs and renewal of equipment.

The Fund will also help local community groups and organisations in providing seed funding for projects supporting health and well being particularly amongst vulnerable groups.

#### Citizens of the World Choir

COTW is a musical family that celebrates artistry, heritage and humanity of people seeking sanctuary, and their allies. The choir is based in London, but has its roots firmly in POTR for two reasons:

- 1. Rebecca Dell, who founded the choir and is Musical Director, started her musical journey in the choir of St Lawrence church.
- 2. She was inspired to set up the choir as a direct result of a sermon she heard at St Lawrence church one Christmas

Central tenets of the choir are to provide kinship and care for those who have escaped from often unimaginably traumatic situations and to use their performances to spread the news that we are all Citizens of the World. They have performed at a huge variety of events from local schools to the Queen's Jubilee Concert in front of millions of people.

Sue & Martyn Dell say: "We have advocated on behalf of the choir since it was founded and have been delighted with the response from members of the Parish who frequently ask for updates on their progress and who support the choir prayerfully.

The choir has performed at St Lawrence church and members would gladly come to talk about their work and the impact it has had on their lives. The Musical Director and a choir member are booked to talk to St Lawrence School during Refugee Week in June 2024. They also produce a regular newsletter which is sent to supporters.

We believe the choir appeals to all ages – young and old alike respond to their music and their message and there are so many ways in which we as a parish can support them. They are in the process of producing their first album which will make their music accessible to a much wider audience."

#### Mission Aviation Fellowship

Isolation is a problem. There are people who, simply because of where they were born, will never have the chance at the same life many of us in the developed world enjoy. A life where their children can go to school, where they can get medical care, where they can get help when disaster strikes, where they can experience the love of Jesus. Millions of people around the world live cut-off from all this and more by either geographic barriers—like jungles, mountains, and deserts—or by social, political, or religious barriers. The vision is to see isolated people changed by the love of Christ.

Each year, MAF provides aviation services to more than 400 mission agencies, churches, and humanitarian organizations around the world. Without MAF, some of these organizations would be unable to reach the people they serve. Through these partnerships, MAF connects isolated people with vital services and goods while sharing the love of Christ in a tangible way. This is how they carry out our mission of serving together to bring help, hope, and healing through aviation.

Locally Alastair and Sandra Smith who worship at Harvest Church are advocates for MAF – we would be able to call upon them for information and talks.

We hope this gives clarity for the foreseeable future on how we will support charities and mission work. We ask you to give generously to enable this to be a successful way forward. If you are organising any event for the parish which involves collecting money please would you work to these agreed areas, asking for guidance if necessary. This list has been generated by Ukraine-based contacts of James Baird, an appeal organiser who ships a huge amount of aid to various parts of Ukraine via an NGO/charity there. James is a Sussex farmer who acquires vehicles, fills them with aid and takes them out to Ukraine. In this instance the aid will be shipped in two stages, at the beginning and end of June. Three HGV trucks are standing by.

The Alton Community Cupboard (situated at the old post office site in the High Street), have agreed to act as drop-off point for donations. They can receive donations on Mon, Wed, Fri, Sat, 9:30-11:30 am.

The Alton & District Community Resilience Fund was established during the Covid pandemic to support people in the Alton area experiencing financial hardship.

Re-branded in 2023, the **Alton & District Community Relief Foundation** (ADCRF) has been taken forward by partnership representation from Harvest Church, Alton Lions Club (CIO) Parish of the Resurrection and Citizens Advice. It has continued to support local individuals and families and is now a registered charity.

The five Trustees receive applications on a referral basis, and award one-time grants of up to £600. With funds going directly to the provider of the goods or service required.

The Trustees also signpost applicants to services and resources, such as Citizens Advice Bureau, Alton Food Bank, Community Cupboard, Resurrection Furniture, Christians Against Poverty (CAP), and youth and family support charities and organisations.

"Where possible, we collaborate with local charities, service organisations and funding sources to avoid duplication and to promote o joined-up response, in a bid to maximise impact and good practice, to support those in need."

Funding for the ADCRF currently comes from Harvest Church, Alton Lions, and from Hampshire County Council's Connect4Communities Fund.

If you are in need, the Alton & District Community Relief Fund may be able to help you.

You will need to be referred, either by a GP Social Prescriber, a Social Worker, a church or a school.

The Alton Stroke Support Group provides support for all stroke survivors, their families and supporters in Alton and the surrounding villages.

We have monthly meetings at Alton Cardiac Rehab Centre (next to Alton Sports Centre) where we provide information, support, social gatherings and health activities, and opportunities to share experiences and make connections. We invite expert speakers on health and related topics of interest to stroke victims, and also arrange monthly activities and visits - for example to garden centres, and in June we are visiting Lasham Glider Heritage Museum.

We meet on the first Tuesday of every month, from 2pm to 3.30pm and ALL stroke survivors, supporters and families ARE WELCOME.

#### Mind the GAP

On Advent Sunday 2009, over 350 people packed St Lawrence Church in Alton to witness a new beginning: the Greater Alton Project, or GAP, which committed its churches to working together in the greater Alton area with the signing of a formal document: "Churches in



Covenanted Partnership". A copy of this document hangs from the corridor wall at Alton Methodist Church.

A working party of Anglicans and Methodists had worked for over two years on this, with the backing and support of their congregations, culminating in unanimous votes from all the churches to go ahead with this new venture in church cooperation: one which is much yearned for in other parts of the country-just ask Rev Keith Underhill!!

Since then, Anglicans and Methodists have been "journeying together" in Alton. The logo's shell acknowledges that our town has grown on The Pilgrim's Way, while also that we are individually and collectively pilgrims on life's journey.

However, the vision is that working together allows us <u>all</u> to better serve, minister and witness in our town. Wasn't that ideal of cooperation Jesus' model for his disciples? Just think of Anna Chaplaincy, started by GAP in Alton.

Those of us who added our names to this covenant in 2009, and are part of its GAP Council - a continuing mini working party - are keen to highlight the role that GAP plays in our churches and our town, as many are new to its concept, or have become indifferent to its commitment.

To this end, clergy will be focusing on GAP from the pulpit in coming months, events will be in church diaries and new challenges will be offered.

If GAP is to serve a purpose, it has to be supported! Of course it's much easier to toddle along to the familiar building and sit in the same seat beside the usual faces each week, but how about visiting one of the other GAP churches and introducing yourself? It's what a new person has to do when they move to Alton.....Try out an order of service that isn't what you're used to. Does it make you concentrate more and so allow God to speak to you more clearly? What about worshipping at a different time: evensong or a late afternoon prayer walk? Do we know the work being done by other Christians in our town; do we support their fundraising or only our own?

GAP is precious; let's be mindful of it!
