First thoughts

Cataract

On the 23rd May this year I had cataract surgery. The need to do this had come as quite a shock as I really hadn't noticed much change in my sight but in retrospect I realised that I was finding it harder to recognise people at a distance and read the newspaper. Once I had accepted this it was full steam ahead and appointments were made confirming the diagnosis and suggested outcomes.

I found myself reflecting on the wonders of modern medicine and the skill of the surgeons. Whereas in previous times I would have been condemned to an increasing loss of sight – I was being offered brand new vision. And what vision! Immediately following the operation I was bowled over by the brightness and sharpening of colours, as I am sure many of you will concur. During a visit to the cathedral I was left wondering if someone had washed the stonework and I was stunned by the brilliance of the stained glass.

Sadly since then then things haven't been plain sailing and my new vision has been blighted by extreme dry-eye and the possibility of further surgery.

This, I feel, often reflects our faith journeys. We may have glimpses of clarity and certainty in faith but at other times we may experience difficult and challenging times of doubt when belief, like sight, becomes clouded or painful and God can seem a remote figure. St John of the Cross refers to this as 'the dark night of the soul'. At such time it can be helpful to cling on, however tenuously, to that which is precious - to maybe just glimmers of faith — even when our vision is much clouded. It can also be helpful to have a reboot or refresh maybe by sharing your worries with a trusted fellow Christian, going on a parish away day, or an Alpha course or a quiet day's retreat. Whatever feeds your soul.

On a slightly different tack the Bible verse that came immediately to my mind post cataract removal was 1 Corinthians 13 verse 12 'For now we see through a glass darkly, but then face to face'. St Paul writes this to describe how our obscure and imperfect vision of reality will change at the end of time when we stand before God 'face to face'. That glimpse of a bright fulfilled world with no sight obstruction - a glorious promise for our futures.


This idea is developed in the book of Revelation where the author describes the new heaven and new earth, where God reigns with absolute benevolence, where there is no more injustice, poverty, disease and despair, no more pain and tears; surely that's the utopia we all long for as our Christian destiny. But the Bible also speaks of our lives here and now and the task we have of bringing heaven down to earth. Every now and then we get a glimpse of what that means – when the hungry are fed (in our food banks), where the broken hearted are comforted (in our bereavement support group) where the lonely are visited and welcomed (in the work of the Anna Chaplains) where our spiritual life is enriched (as we come together to worship and learn from God's word). As we do so we

experience a glimpse, through a mirror, of the Kingdom of God breaking into our world now, although in its fullest sense that clarity of vision, when we see God face to face, is yet to come.

Try to treasure and store those moments of joy and vision of God's Kingdom as they help to carry us through the cloudy days.





Pastoral Care

Some time ago I wrote about Pastoral Care in the Parish in Sunrise. I remember saying in that article that pastoral care is all our responsibility and I want to reinforce this. We live by the saying of Jesus 'love one another as I have loved you' and the many other Biblical mandates that encourage and exhort us to 'care for each other'. Our coming together in worship, prayer, Bible study and fellowship connects us in so many ways and builds strong relationships between us. We are to cultivate these relationships into deep bonds of hospitality, concern and mutual affection. Therefore the main spine of our pastoral care is that we care for each other naturally and treat/love each other as we would want to be treated and loved ourselves.

Recently Sarah Neish, David Chattell and I met with a group of people representing each of our congregations to discuss our procedures for pastoral care. It was a good and encouraging meeting. The outcome is that we could put together a comprehensive system for pastoral care but that we wouldn't! We are very aware of the many possibilities there are across the parish to look after and love one another: home groups, there are a good number of them; the Tuesday coffee morning in Holybourne; the Friday coffee and cakes in St Lawrence Church; the Beech Lunch Club; the Wednesday communion service at All Saints followed by coffee and conversation; Church@4; the monthly market; Sunday morning after service refreshments; Men's Walking Church; Meet & Eat - to name just a few. Each church has a focal minister and Churchwardens - they are the first call for alerting any care needs. They can arrange for people to visit, offer home communion, be a liaison. The focal ministers may call on others to help. Their role is to foster the culture of everyone being everyone's pastoral care! The group that met will meet once a term to touch base about the pastoral care needs within each congregation.

In October and November we are planning a teaching series on pastoral care based on some of the stories in Luke's Gospel which we hope will help us to understand our caring of one another. We are going to include in Parish Matters, the weekly emails and further copies of Sunrise hints to help. We'd love to hear stories of our caring and helping each other. Perhaps there are ways of writing short articles in further copies of Sunrise or to include in our weekly email. Maybe share news of your home group or activity and the ways in which people have been loved and cared for.

So what is our policy for pastoral care? It is us being here for each other. We are already putting this policy into practice and we are simply just encouraging more of it!






