#### First thoughts

I really enjoyed the preaching series we had through September on The Five Marks of Mission. The Five Marks of Mission were devised by the Anglican Consultative Council in the 1980s in an attempt to give a focus to the unity of the worldwide Anglican Communion and then was also adopted by most other major denomination is this country at least. They help us in evaluating our mission and many churches and dioceses use them to agree action plans. I see mission as 'joining in with what God is doing' so as we thought about them I hope we could see what God is doing and how we could join in more fully.

#### The Marks of Mission are:

- To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom
- To teach, baptise and nurture new believers
- To respond to human need by loving service
- To seek to transform unjust structures of society, to challenge violence of every kind and to pursue peace and reconciliation
- To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life
  of the earth

When we began I preached on the first mark and said it is the overriding mark from which the others flow. I talked about four cultures that I thought were important if we were to be proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom and I took these from the story of The Road to Emmaus in Luke Chapter 24. I want to reiterate these cultures:

**Culture of Gospel Conversation.** As the two walked from Jerusalem to Emmaus they were talking to each other and they were engaged in the story of what had happened over the last few days with Jesus in Jerusalem. Then a man joins them and joins in. If we are to make a difference for the kingdom we are to have good natural Gospel conversations.

**Culture of Accompaniment.** And this was a walk all the way together and the stranger who joined them also went the whole way to Emmaus. There was no giving up or even changing the conversation along the way. They accompanied each other. In proclaiming the kingdom we need to walk alongside people, having the conversation. Don't give up!

**Culture of Hospitality and Invitation.** When they arrived in Emmaus - they had walked about 10 miles. And the two, Cleopas and his friend, invited the man who had joined them to stay and eat. How important it is to show kindness and invite people maybe for coffee somewhere or for lunch or cake or whatever. Deeper relationships are formed around the table. In proclaiming the kingdom let's get inviting and show our gracious hospitality.

**Culture of Experience.** And then around that dinner table the man who joined Cleopas and his friend broke the bread and they realised that it was Jesus. All that conversation, accompaniment, hospitality and invitation led to them recognising Jesus. Wouldn't it be wonderful if we were able to do the same for people we know? Proclaiming the kingdom means making space for Jesus to be known.

And now you may be thinking, that's great but help me. On 4th December we are holding a Christmas Event with the internationally renowned speaker Canon J John at The Alton Maltings. It will be a Christmas carol service with good hospitality and the chance for people to have afresh an experience of recognising and knowing Jesus. Would you consider inviting 3 people to come with you? At our Parish Away Day we were told that if we invite 3 then 1 is likely to come. Please I ask you to start the conversation about the event, accompany your three for the next couple of months, invite them and show them hospitality along the way and pray for the Jesus experience. We will be issuing tickets soon.

I also think these cultures could shape our seven churches as grow forward in this new season and I will be thinking, praying and discussing these more. Do they strike a chord with you? Would they help us all to work on the Five Marks of Mission? Is this God speaking to us?

Have a good October folks.


#### Safeguarding Statement



#### Anna Chaplaincy for Older People

Anna Chaplaincy for Older People began in here in Alton. It's all thanks to a collaboration between The Parish of the Resurrection and Aton Methodist Church that the idea got off the ground back in 2010. Debbie Thrower was the first Anna Chaplain and now there are more than 400 across the UK. Debbie said that from the start, she'd thought how much her own parents could have benefited from such a chaplain... 'Why aren't these everywhere?' she wondered. Over time there was so much interest from further afield that by 2014 we needed a website and an infrastructure. That's where BRF (Bible Reading Fellowship) came in. We mainly knew about them because of the Bible Reading notes many of us read and we had seen the success they'd had scaling up Messy Church (which also began in a Hampshire church incidentally). After some good conversations it was decided to gift the concept to BRF, knowing the charity's track record for incubating grassroots Christian initiatives.

That is why we had our celebration service on Sunday 15th September - to mark the 10th birthday of Anna Chaplaincy being with BRF Ministries. We held a joint service in St Lawrence Church attended by our current Anna Chaplain, Kate Powell, and our previous ones - Rachel Sturt, Helen Jesty, Jon Rooke and of course, Debbie Thrower. Debbie Thrower has recently retired as the Team Leader of Anna Chaplaincy at BRF and so we were joined by Debbie Ducille the new one and others from the team. Also Richard Fisher the CEO of BRF was with us and read one of our Bible readings. We celebrated well and then sent Debbie Ducille off on her pilgrimage walk to Abingdon. We carried on 'partying' with birthday cake and drinks.

What a great story we have - a small pioneering idea formulated over coffee in Alton - now a groundbreaking, growing national movement. We have certainly put the flag into ground which says 'older people matter'. The name is inspired by the widow Anna who appears with Simeon in Luke's gospel — both fine role models of faithful older people. Candlemas is the season of celebrating the way Simeon and Anna waited expectantly for God to do what he promised. It was they who recognised the baby Jesus as the longed-for Messiah. So, far from being old and stuck in their ways, looking to the past, *they* were the ones alert and ready to embrace the new! Long may that continue and long may Anna Chaplaincy thrive and grow and we are looking forward to 20th birthday





I've said hello to Michelangelo's David and seen more religious paintings than I've had Gin and Tonics. Yes. That many!

Here are a few little facts you might not know about those Pointy Pine trees in Tuscany (and I don't mean the little red people in The Night Garden-grandparents of toddlers among us will know what I mean). Back in the day, Cypress trees or Pencil Pines as they are also known, were thought to join earth and heaven as they pointed upwards to the skies and were often planted as symbols of fertility. They were also discovered to have insect repelling powers, which was useful for combatting insect and mosquito bites, of which I had many. They make great wind breaks and when the wind whips across the mountains and valleys they help to protect olive groves and vineyards. They denoted your level of wealth to your neighbours, the longer your cypress lined driveway the richer you were and I can tell you we saw some pretty impressive villas. Here's the last curious fact about Cypress tree. At the time of the Via Francigena, the pilgrim route, Cypress trees were used as 'road signs' (segnali stradali) for pilgrims (I pellegrini) coming from northern Europe. Very visible from afar, the number of Cypress tree indicated, for example:

Un (one) Cipresso indicated "a rest area" (area di riposo); Due (two) Cipressi a "restaurant" (un'osteria) at that time; and Tre (three) Cipressi an "hostel" (un ostello).


So, there you go. From road signs to riches to restaurants the cypress tree tells all.

I don't think they have a Duomo choral tradition in Italy like we do here which is strange given that so many composers of glorious church music were Italian - Vivaldi, Palestrina, Vittoria to name a few. As a committed Renaissance babe, I would have liked to have come across a group of Italians singing Cantate Domino! However, I did have a ride on the Carousel in the Piazza Republica in Florence and that did have organ music. Bellissima!

Arrivederci, my little pizza pies and start thinking about your trees, pointy pines or otherwise!

#### Do you gamble too much, or too often?

Fresh Start is based on principles from the 12-steps-of-recovery process, backed by 1-to-1 coaching and a support group of others wanting to tackle their habits. And it's free and completely confidential.






